DIFFERENT SUNLIT ZONES IN THE HOUSE FOR INDOOR CONTAINER PLANTS

Dividing different locations or zones in the house based on the amount of light they receive.

Different plants have different light requirements and placing the plant at the right location can drastically improve your indoor container gardening experience. A wall of a room having a window facing east or west directions can also receive enough sunlight in summer or spring season. This can be an ideal time to grow certain herbs, greens, or alpine strawberries on this wall.

Strawberries, many herbs, and perhaps small fruiting vegetables are ideal for an east-facing indoor windowsill.

Large skylight providing sunlight all day long is also excellent for growing most of the container plants. However, it should not be blocked by buildings or trees.
