



PARTIALLY SUNLIT ZONES IN THE HOUSE FOR INDOOR CONTAINER PLANTS

Here are areas of the house with partial sunlight for indoor container plants.

Make sure that you use this chart based on your local climate. If your climate is cool and overcast, moving the plants in full sunlight can be helpful.

It is possible in some cases that the walls in an east or west facing windowed room may be brighter than the floor of the room.

You can try and grow leafy vegetables on or near this wall. You can use grow lights in case the area is dark.

Along with other plants, shade tolerant herbs can also be grown on this table. Receiving some sunlight from the west facing window will be more than enough for these herbs.

On a wall facing west, plants like Alpine strawberries will grow well.

This corner of the room with the west facing window is fairly dark.

TIP: Grow lights can be used in this corner to glow plants.

AREA 6

At window height, a table in the middle of a room with a west facing window should be sufficiently bright to grow flowering plants, leafy crops, herbs, and Alpine strawberries.

Growing green leafy and root plants, Alpine strawberries, or shade-tolerant herbs that like bright light for part of the day will do well in the middle of the room with a large, east-facing window.
