



WINDOWSILL AND COOLER ZONES IN THE HOUSE FOR INDOOR CONTAINER PLANTS

Here are areas of the house with cooler and more ventilated climate for indoor container plants.

These cooler temperatures help the fruiting plants to produce fruits the subsequent year.

Make sure that the windowsill can sustain the weight of the containers.

Attach metal brackets or a grille to prevent the window-box / container / planter from breaking your windowsill and falling off.

Sow seed in spring for an early summer harvest of leafy salad crops on a windowsill.



AREA 8

After the last frosts have passed, grow tomatoes, geraniums, tender herbs and chiles on a window sill.

As an alternative, you can also grow robust herbs like sage and rosemary or strawberries round the year.

An unheated and sunlit hallway will be ideal for plants like carrots.

AREA 7

South-facing glass front doors provide sufficient light to root systems, leaves, and many herbs that can thrive in cool conditions, as well as fruit trees during the winter months.

For fruit plants, a cool, sunny hallway is a perfect place to overwinter.
